From the Desk of Rev. Karen



March was a busy and exciting month and April promises to be the same. The women's group has been studying various prayer forms which included Advent wreathes, labyrinths, and

Lectio Divina. In March we concluded our study by designing and making our own Anglican prayer beads. The adult Sunday Bible study has focused on the Islamic faith. I think I can speak for most of us that we were surprised at the commonalities of our faiths and gained a new appreciation and understanding of our brothers and sisters whose common bond is through Abraham. Our last lesson will be April 2 and after Easter our focus will turn to stewardship of God's creation. We celebrated Shrove Tuesday with our traditional pancake supper sponsored by the men of Saint Stephen's. It was a special evening full of good food and fellowship. We gathered again for our quarterly parish dinner and feasted on muffuletta sandwiches, gumbo and shrimp jambalaya. As you can might have guessed the theme was Mardi Gras and laughs and giggles were abundant.

The Mission Committee has been hard at work researching the needs of the Newton community and with the vestry's approval has authorized three organizations who will each receive \$2000; the Newton school lunch deficit, The ARL, and food pantry at Berg School. Another exciting project is soon to become a reality. The Tracy's provided the inspiration for a blessing box, Jack Trotter built it and soon it will be used to distribute food and hygiene products to those in need.

The Revival held at St. Stephen's on March 17 was a testimony to the creativity, commitment and willingness to embrace new ideas that is so characteristic of our congregation. The music led by our choir was spirited, the testimonies uplifting and the activities provided at the prayer stations gave many a chance to

reflect on their spiritual journey. The evening was topped by a delicious array of treats and a chance to visit with old and new friends. If you missed this revival you have another opportunity. On May 6, the Diocese of Iowa invites us to travel as a group to Kansas City, Missouri to participate in the Presiding Bishop's revival there. The "Awakening the Spirit" event will be at Kansas City's Power & Light District from noon-3:00 pm. This will be followed by an online discussion with Bishop Scarfe and fellow Iowa Episcopalians on April 6 from 7 to 8pm to discuss what it means to be a sanctuary church. 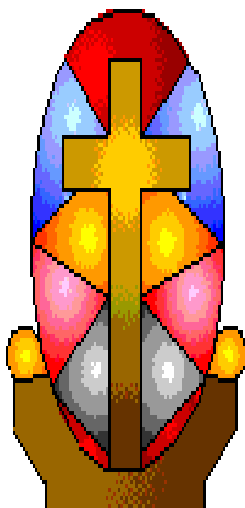

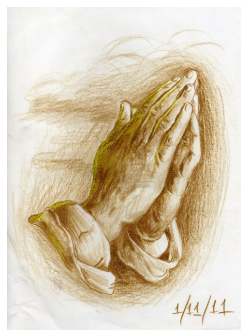

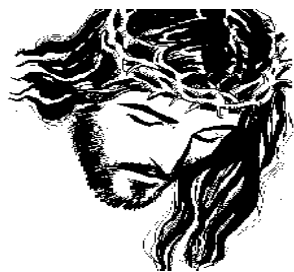

# HOLY WEEK Schedule and Easter

*Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday and concludes with the Holy Saturday Service. Easter is of course the Great Feast and is not part of Holy Week.*

**Palm Sunday, April 9, 8 am** with palms, no procession **10 am** with palms and procession beginning in Latham Hall and processing through the church.

A Prayer for Palm Sunday: Are you ever amazed, O Lord, at our responses to the Savior? We get all excited about the parade into Jerusalem. We gather palm fronds and distribute them among those present so that they can wave them in triumph, replicating the parade and the crowd. Children sing the praises of Jesus. Adults remove their cloaks and place them on the road in front of the donkey so that he may not make a misstep. We could stay at this scene forever and enjoy the moment. But we are being called forward, through the gates of the Holy City to the Temple and from the Temple to the Cross. Be with us and give us courage to face what lies ahead. Strengthen our faith that we will remain steadfast at the time of reckoning; for we ask this in Jesus' Name. Amen.

**Maundy Thursday, April 13, 7:30 pm**

Jesus humbly washes the feet of his disciples as a profound reminder that we are all called to serve and to share in table fellowship. In this service we will take part in both the washing of feet and the sharing of a meal. At the end, the table will be stripped and the watch – our waiting with Jesus – continues in the sanctuary until midnight.

**Good Friday Community Cross Walk Friday, April 14 at noon** beginning here at St Stephen's.

This is an ancient practice that recalls the last events of Jesus' earthly life: being condemned to death, given his cross, his long walk to Golgotha, his crucifixion and death. There are 14 stations in all. This is a solemn time to contemplate Jesus' suffering and death.

**Good Friday Service, April 14, 7:30 pm (St. Stephen's)**

Through fasting and quiet prayer, the passion and death of Jesus Christ are remembered in solemn reverence on Good Friday. There will be a reserved Eucharist.

**Holy Saturday, April 15, 9 am**

This is often referred to as the Holy Sabbath and the Great Sabbath. It is an empty day, the day when Christ rested in the tomb and all creation awaited the resurrection.

**Easter Sunday, April 16, 9 am (one service)**

The most holy of feast days for Christians, Easter celebrates the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. This is a sung Eucharist celebration. Following is an enhanced coffee hour and an outdoor Easter egg hunt for children, weather permitting.
