From the desk of Rev. Karen

I write this letter to you on the eve of my 72nd birthday. This is a critical year in the life of an Episcopal priest because it is the year of mandatory retirement. Mandatory unless the vestry, priest, and Bishop request and grant an additional year. This process is then repeated on a yearly basis. I, as well as the vestry, have requested that I continue to serve as your rector. The Bishop has granted verbal permission but we have received nothing in writing, so an element of uncertainty exists. I mention this because elements of uncertainty in our life loom like an evil spirit that can prevent us from moving forward and living our life to the fullest. In my mind, succumbing to this uncertainty borders on a breach of faith. Each minute, each day, each year, is a gift to be used to glorify God as best we know how. This gift of time is not to be wasted worrying about the "what next". In faith we keep in our hearts that God walks with us and guides us. However, it is important that we pay attention to the uncertainties that life presents and use them as stepping stones instead of

barriers. It is also important to counter-balance them by rejoicing in all the goodness that surrounds us.

On January 21 we will have an opportunity to do both at our Annual Meeting. It will be a time to celebrate our life as a parish and plan for the future. The parish survey results from this fall indicate that we are facing some uncertainties. They center around our dwindling numbers, fewer families with children, and the desire for a greater number of people who can help do God's work.



Ignoring our uncertainties will not make them go away, in fact they will only become more threatening. We need to address them head on and prayerfully take action. Its time to think out of the box, consider new ideas but most important to come together and celebrate the gift of being a member of St. Stephen's.

Happy New Year and may God bless us all as we strive to do God's work to bring forth the heavenly kingdom.

December Mission Update

1. The mission committee met on December 10, 2017. Due to a change in policy by the Salvation Army children over the age of 12 were not designated to receive Christmas gifts this year. As a result St. Nick's lacked funds to serve the 650 children in need. The mission requested and it was approved by the vestry that \$5000 be given to St. Nick's.
2. Rita Baker is serving on a committee that is examining the need for mental health facilities in Jasper County.
3. Neighbors helping neighbors is a group made up of people from several churches in Newton. Their current project is to provide free laundry nights for those in need. They also provided a free clothing event.
4. The Blessing Box has received blankets, coats, and shoes from the Lutheran church and donations from Texas. Currently between \$200 and \$250 is spent each week. There is a huge need for socks, caps, and blankets.
