What is a Reverse Advent Box?

This is the question I put to Winonah McGee when she suggested this as being part of the December Christmas Dinner. I have heard of Advent Calendars but not a reverse Advent box. This was her response, “The idea comes from the Advent calendar being a way to count down to Christmas, sometimes with a small gift or treat each day. Why not count down (in our case) the 12 days of Christmas by giving a daily gift to someone else? Thusly a reverse countdown to Christmas.” With a little more prodding I am able to share with you more about this project. It sounds like fun! We hope you will be able to participate.

Do you remember "The Best Christmas Ever"? Was it gifts? Was it being with special people? Was it tradition and ritual?

This year you have an opportunity to make this "The Best Christmas Ever" for someone that might not have as much as you/I have been blessed with. Starting Nov. 20 each of us can make a difference by picking up a Reverse Advent Box and filling it with personal items, toys, food, socks, mittens, hats, etc. Divided boxes (such as boxes wine bottles come in) will be available at the Church or from Winonah McGee. Between Nov. 20 and our Christmas party, Dec. 2, please fill one section each day with a gift—please make it a new item. If you can let Winonah know before Nov. 15 that you are interested, she will have time to gather enough boxes for all those interested (or if you want to save wine bottle boxes that would help also). You can designate whether your box goes to the Salvation Army or to St. Nick's Christmas Club. Then bring your box to the Dec. 2nd "Best Christmas Party" ever and help make this the "Best Christmas Ever" for someone else this year.
