ARE YOU READY?

September begins the new program year at St. Stephen's and it promises to be full of new opportunities for fun, service and a deepening of our relationship with God. We kick off the year with one service at 9:00 on September 10 followed by a picnic at my place...yard games, potluck, and conversation.

Calendar wise this will be an unusual year: Christmas Eve is on a Sunday, as is New Year's Eve. Lent presents its own unusual calendar. Ash Wednesday is on Valentine's Day and Easter Day is on April Fool's Day. Your liturgy and music committee has planned some exciting services which address the unusual placement of our major feast days. For instance, we will celebrate Epiphany with a special service on Saturday which will include a delightful pageant and parish dinner. We will have an opportunity to worship in new ways but also revisit our traditional services, such as the Blessing of the Animal, All Souls/All Saints Day, Thanksgiving Eve and the Blue Christmas service of Hope and Remembrance. So the old will be blended with the new, but most important we will have many wonderful ways to worship.

The Adult Bible study begins Sunday, September 17, and will be led by Kathy Trotter this year. The focus will be on Holy Women and Holy Men. This promises to be an exciting way to understand how God has been present in the lives of men and women

throughout the ages, whom we lift up as saints. The Book Club's fall focus is on the Holy Spirit and we will begin by reading "Who is the Holy Spirit"? A Walk with the Apostles by Amos Long. Join us on Tuesday's at 9 for coffee, treats, and great conversation. The women's group will continue to meet on the first Saturday of the month and the men's will meet the second Saturday.

Our emphasis this year is, what is God calling us to do, both as an individual and a parish to bring justice to the world. The food pantry garden is in need of people to harvest beans, potatoes, and tomatoes while the Crop Walk and Take Away Hunger efforts will soon be requesting volunteers. St. Stephen's deepening relationship with the Sudanese community is bringing to light their many needs and the question how might we help is becoming a strong call. The need for contributions to the Blessing Box and the Salvation Army remain an important part of our ministry.

Daily we face our own personal needs as well as those in the greater community. Sometimes it feels overwhelming. It is when we gather as a community to pray and come to the Lord's table, that we receive the strength and guidance to face the sometimes troubled waters in our life. 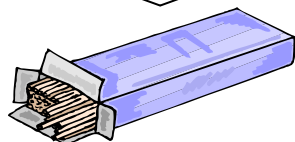


JASPER COUNTY CROP WALK SUNDAY, OCT. 1st AT 2:00 P. M.

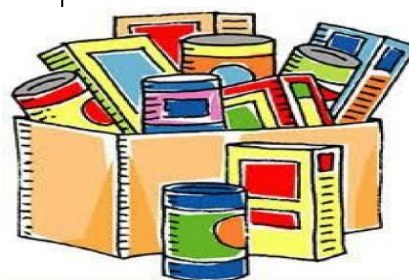

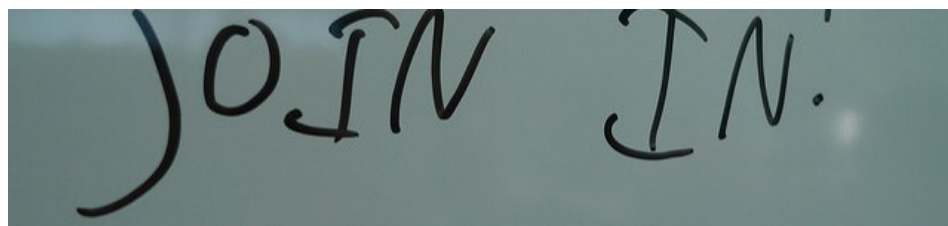
